
On this day of ... September 2011, IC-Argentina and Mayors for Peace agree in their determination to cooperate together to free cities of the scourge of war and mass-destruction. The threat of nuclear catastrophe, recognized unanimously by the State Parties to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, must be lifted from our cities and all of humanity without delay.

IC-Argentina openly declares its support for the Mayors for Peace 2020 Vision Campaign to eliminate all nuclear weapons by the year 2020; and calls upon all Mayors from Latin America to formally join Mayors for Peace (registration-form in annex).

IC-Argentina will publish information on its website (and other publications) and will make optimal use of its database to raise the presence and activities of Mayors for Peace in the region. IC-Argentina will also support the establishment of relationships with other Associations of Local Governments when possible.

Mayors for Peace engages to offer IC-Argentina visibility and recognition through the Mayors for Peace network (as now 4,984 members in 151 countries and regions). This through reports of the valuable contributions of IC-Argentina and the use of their logo in our publications (web page, electronic newsletter, Progress Report, ...).

IC-Argentina and Mayors for Peace intend to establish a close, long-lasting relationship and will actively explore avenues of further cooperation, such as the organization of events and advise towards fundraising to establish Mayors for Peace in the region.


